

Eyfs – Activities Grid

Create a work of art using leaves, pinecones, feathers and twigs. Send a picture of your art work to your teacher. 	Look out of your window once each day. Keep a diary of the wildlife you see. Write the date. Then write down the names of the wildlife you see. What do they look like? What do they do?	Can you find out 5 facts about your favourite wild animal. Use books and the internet to find out the information. Write down each fact on a new line.	Make a nature mobile. What natural objects can you find? What colours are on your mobile? 	Make a bug house. Use an empty tissue box or egg carton. Fill it with a collection of leaves, twigs, grass and other natural materials. Check each day to see what bugs come to live in the bug house.
Draw a wild landscape. Use your imagination. Are there trees, bushes, birds, hills? What is the weather like in your picture? 	Write a wild poem. Choose a minibeast or animal that lives in the wild in this country. Write a poem about it. An example might be: A worm is long A worm is wiggly A worm has no legs	Search for ladybirds. Have you found any? How many spots did they have? Make a paper plate ladybird. 	Draw a map of your local area. Draw the wildlife you see on your walk onto the map where you have seen it.	Go on a wildflower hunt. Draw and label the wildflowers you see. Look at the shape and colour of the petals. How many different types of flowers have you found? Check the list given. Have you found any of these?

Activities to do regularly

Practice writing some of the sounds you have practiced on “Teach your monster to read”. What words have you learnt? Draw pictures of the characters you have met.	How is your plant diary going? Have your seeds grown tall?  What do they need to grow? Remember to keep a regular diary of how your seeds grow with pictures as things change.
