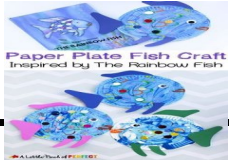


Exfs – Activities Grid

Read .the story the Rainbow Fish. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tU5ot9R2p6A How many colours can you see on the rainbow fish? Draw/paint a picture of The Rainbow Fish . Try to use all the colours from the story.	Use a paper plate to make a rainbow fish. Paint the whole plate blue. Once it is dry stick a blue tail and some fins onto the fish. Then use sequins, stickers or small pieces of paper to decorate the fish. 	How many fish can you name? use books and the internet to find out the names of different fish. What colour or shape are they? What patterns do their scales have? Draw an underwater picture showing all the different fish you have found discovered.	Use wax crayons to draw an underwater picture. Include The Rainbow Fish and other creatures and plants that live under the sea. Then wash over the picture with water tinted with a tiny bit of blue paint.	Use an egg carton box to create an under the ocean scene. Include plants fish shells etc . Send your teacher a picture of your finished box. 
Make some star shaped salt dough models. Decorate them in different ways to create a family of star fish. What colours and patterns can you do? 	The rainbow fish had to learn to share. What can you share today? Write a sentence to tell us how you have shared something today.	Make a wise old octopus like the one in the story. Use paper chains for the octopus 's legs. 	Some creatures that live in the oceans are becoming extinct. Can you find out which creatures are endangered and need special help? How can we help the creatures that live in the oceans to stay safe?	Make a poster to share what you have learnt and to tell people how they can help the creatures that live in the ocean. Make your poster bold and bright.

Activities to do regularly

Colour, cut and stick to make one of your 3 dimensional animals . Give each one you do a name and hang them in your room to make an animal display!	Read one of the books on Oxford Owls: https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/ Write a sentence about your favourite part of the story for each one you read. Remember to keep a list of the books you read.	Use “Teach your monster to read” and play reading games. https://www.teachyourmonstertoread.com/ [free account] at least three times a week. 	Practice writing some of the sounds you have practiced on “Teach your monster to read”. What words have you learnt? Draw pictures of the characters you have met.	How is your plant diary going? Have your seeds grown tall?  What do they need to grow? Remember to keep a regular diary of how your seeds grow with pictures as things change.
