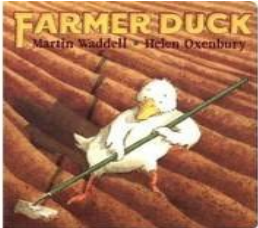


Eyfs – Activities Grid

Read the story 'Farmer Duck' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Gug6P8l1q6c Can you retell the story using different voices for the different animals in the story?	Draw a picture of your favourite part of the story. Write a sentence about the picture you have drawn. 	Make a yellow handprint duck picture. Paint your hand with yellow paint and press it down on the paper. Once it is dry you can draw on wings, a beak and an eye. You could make ducklings with yellow finger prints. 	Make a mask for all the farm animals in the story. Make a card circle. Cut out two holes for eyes.. (ask a grown up for help if you need to). Colour your mask the correct colours. 	Farmer Duck had to do all the jobs in the story. Do you do any jobs at home to help your family? Ask the grown ups at home if there are any jobs or tasks you can do to help them. 
Use white cupcake cases. To make a sheep from the story. Cut out legs and a face using black paper or card and stick onto the case to make a sheep. Then stick on two googly eyes. 	Lots of our food comes from the farm. Make a list of the food in your house that has come from the farm. How many things can you find? Remember when you write a list write the words underneath each other.	Make a farm animal quiz. Write or record your question. Can your family guess the answers? What animals are your questions about? Eg I am pink and have a curly tail. What am I?	Write a list of all the farm animals you can think of. Write down where they live on the farm and what they eat.	Farmers often have scarecrows on the farm to protect their crops. Here is an action song about a scarecrow to learn. What other farm songs do you know? Sing them for your family. Can you learn any new ones?

Activities to do regularly

Colour, cut and stick to make one of your 3 dimensional animals . Give each one you do a name and hang them in your room to make an animal display!	Read one of the books on Oxford Owls: https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/ Write a sentence about your favourite part of the story for each one you read. Remember to keep a list of the books you read.	Use "Teach your monster to read" and play reading games. https://www.teachyourmonstertoread.com/ [free account] at least three times a week. 	Practice writing some of the sounds you have practiced on "Teach your monster to read". What words have you learnt? Draw pictures of the characters you have met.	How is your plant diary going? Have your seeds grown tall?  What do they need to grow? Remember to keep a regular diary of how your seeds grow with pictures as things change.
Watch Alphablocks on You Tube and practice your phase 3 sounds. Try to practice a different sound each day. 	Look at the Numbots website and start the story mode questions. Explore all the sections painting pictures and playing the games. Try a new one each day! 	Play a board game with your family. What is your favourite game to play? What do you enjoy playing it?
