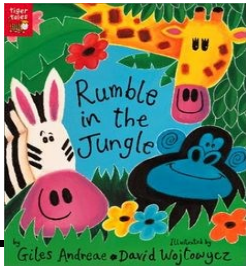


Exts – Activities Grid

Read the story 'There's a rumble in the jungle' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=D2-Q1LkCzpM Re-read the story and shout out all the rhyming words. Repeat by whispering all the rhyming words.	Draw a picture of your favourite part of the story. Write a sentence about the picture you have drawn. 	Draw a long snake on a large piece of paper. Cut it out. Remember to make your snake curvy and slithery. Now decorate your snake with different shapes and colours. Have you made a pattern? 	Rumble in the Jungle is a rhyming story. Can you write some lists of words that rhyme with: Cat dog pan tap Can you make any more rhyming lists?	This is a story set in the jungle. Can you make a jungle book? Is your book going to be a story book or an information book? What jungle animals are you going to include in the book? 
Paint a picture of a jungle animal from the story doing its favourite activity. Is it swinging through the trees? Eating some jungle leaves? Playing with water?	Do some baking with an adult. Can you make some elephant shaped cookies? Or maybe you've made some different animal shaped biscuits. Take a lovely picture of your baking before you eat them up!	Make a jungle collage picture. Include as many animals from the story as you can. Also include some jungle plants and background. 	Draw 4 large circles. Label each circle...jungle....farm...house (pets)sea. Now draw 4 animals in each circle that live in those places. Colour your pictures in the correct animal colours.	Make a jungle rain stick musical instrument. Use a tube for the instrument. Fill it with pasta or rice or lentils for example. Food that will make a noise. Then decorate it with green jungle plants. Make some music!

Activities to do regularly

Colour, cut and stick to make one of your 3 dimensional animals . Give each one you do a name and hang them in your room to make an animal display!	Read one of the books on Oxford Owls: https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/ Write a sentence about your favourite part of the story for each one you read. Remember to keep a list of the books you read.	Use "Teach your monster to read" and play reading games. https://www.teachyourmonstertoread.com/ [free account] at least three times 	Practice writing some of the sounds you have practiced on "Teach your monster to read". What words have you learnt? Draw pictures of the characters you have met.	How is your plant diary going?  Have your seeds grown tall? What do they need to grow? Remember to keep a regular diary of how your seeds grow with pictures as things change.
