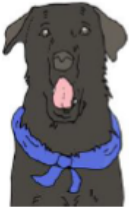
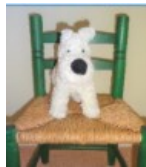
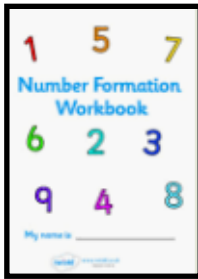
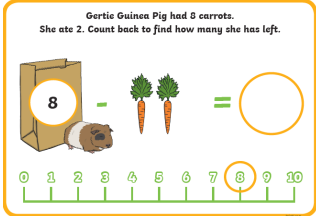


Daily Literacy and Maths Activities - wb - 22nd June

<u>Literacy</u> This week is the second week of our new Literacy project all about Max the dog!	 Max told us the story of his walk and how he collected sticks. Can you make up your own dog walk story? What would your dog be called? Where would you go and what would you find? Look at the Monday pages to help you draw pictures of each event in your story. Use the pictures to retell your story!	Look at the pictures on the Literacy Tuesday pages. they introduce 3 position words that match the photos. Match each word with a picture and then make up a sentence using each word. Write your sentences using your best letter formation on the lines or in your book. 	Handwriting practice! Complete pages in your letter formation booklet. Think carefully where the letter starts and which way it goes! Always start from the dot! 	Play the preposition game! Look at the Literacy Thursday pages. Snowy is hiding! Make up an oral sentence for each picture of Max's friend to say where Snowy is hiding. Now write the words on paper and hide one of your toys labelling where they are. Take a photo of each one. 	Let's make a rhyme! Listening carefully to rhymes can help us with spelling and hearing the sounds we need to use as we write. Look at the Rhyming Game on Friday's Literacy pages. Ask an adult to play the rhyming game with you. Can you write the words that you think of? 
<u>Maths</u> This week we are going to look at counting on and back, to and from 10.	Play a hidden maths addition game. Ask an adult to play with you and ask them to count out 5 pennies, buttons or similar type of object.  Cover the objects with a tea towel and pick 2 more of the objects. Place them on the cloth how many do you have altogether? Remove the cloth to check. Play again using different numbers. Can you write the number sentence?	Look at the PowerPoint on the Maths Tuesday pages and work through them with a grown up helping you to read the questions. You may want some counters or buttons to help you work out the answers. Now look at the second page and with your grown up reading the questions, answer them and create a number sentence at the bottom.	Complete pages in your number formation booklet.  Think carefully where the number starts and which way it goes! Always start from the dot!	The hungry Monkey has been eating all the bananas! Tell the number story and remember to cross off the number of bananas he ate off the first picture to help you work out the answer.  Draw how many are left in the last box and write the number	Look at the Guinea Pig questions on the PowerPoint on the Maths Friday pages. Follow the instructions to help you answer the example questions and then try the written questions too.  Now try the Maths Challenge and find the missing numbers!
