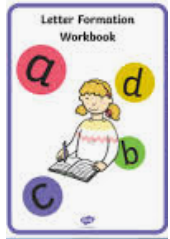
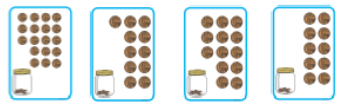


Daily Literacy and Maths Activities - wb - 1st June

<u>Literacy</u> This week we will continue our project with Mavis the Cat—look out for the extra pages to help you with the activities.	Out and About! In your garden or on your daily exercise look around for any minibeasts you can find. You can use the Literacy Monday page to help you record what you see or you can draw and label your own pictures. I found ... 	 On Literacy Tuesday you will see 2 fact files that Mavis made to share with you. Read all the information that she found out about worms and spiders with a grown up. My Worm Fact File Name: earthworm Colour: reddish brown Number of legs: none Did you know! - Earthworms have no eyes. - They eat dead leaves. - They are covered in hairs to help them move. My Spider Fact File Name: spider Colour: eight are brown or black and some are bright red, green or yellow Number of legs: eight Did you know! - Spiders are not insects. - They spin a web to catch their food. - They lay eggs. <u>Maths</u> This week we are going to look at counting to 20.	Look through the PowerPoint on Maths Monday with an grown up and take time to answer the questions. Try to have 20 counters, pennies, buttons or something small near with you in case you need then to help you count. 	Today we are going to use pennies to help us count to 20. Ask a grown up if you can have 20 pennies to help you. Work through the Tuesday PowerPoint using the on screen pennies to count out the cost of each item. Use your own pennies to copy the counting and check for real. 	Complete 2 pages in your number formation booklet.  Think carefully where the number starts and which way it goes! Always start from the dot!	Count and write how many pennies you have to add to each money jar.  Look at the money jars on the Maths Thursday page. Count the pennies that are ready to be added to each money jar and write the number inside the blue box. Make sure you count carefully!	Play a game with a grown up where you have to guess their number between 10 and 20. They tell you what is either one more or one less than their number and you can use your number line to work out their number!  Play this a few times then have a going counting with the Superhero I spy page on the Maths Friday page.
