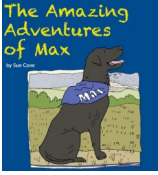
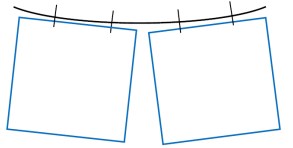
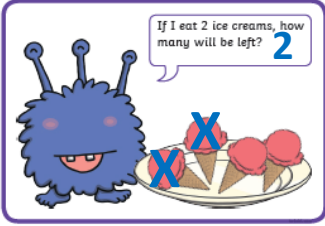
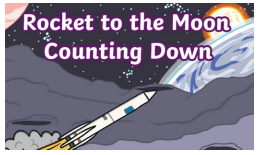


Daily Literacy and Maths Activities - wb - 15th June

<u>Literacy</u> This week we will begin an new Literacy project all about Max the dog! We hope you enjoy it!	Reading together!  With a grown up read the story of Max's Amazing Adventure on his walk. Throughout the story there are lots of highlighted conjunctions. These are words that help us join parts of the story together. Another conjunction is the word because try to use this word when you are answering questions to help you explain your answers.	Sequencing Fun Oh no! The photos from Max's walk have all been mixed up! Take a look at the Literacy Tuesday page. Can you number the photos in the correct order? If you cant print the page draw your own pictures, adding numbers for each one. 	Handwriting practice! Complete pages in your letter formation booklet. Think carefully where the letter starts and which way it goes! Always start from the dot! 	Role Play Reread or listen to the story again. The photos all show the middle of the story but some things happened before and after. Looking at these parts especially, can you act out what Max did? Make sure that you act them out in the right order. 	Beginning and End! All the photos were from the middle of Max's walk so we need to help Max by drawing pictures of the things at the beginning and end of his walk. Use the Literacy Friday page to draw in the pictures or create your own page of pictures. 
<u>Maths</u> This week we are going to look at subtracting by counting back. First from 5 and then from 10.	Read through the Hungry Monster PowerPoint. Look carefully as the monster eats the goodies and workout how many are left. Check your answers using the number line 	Look at the questions on the Maths Tuesday page. Count how many the monster has on the plate.  How many does the monster eat? Cross those off the plate and write down how many are left.	Complete pages in your number formation booklet.  Think carefully where the number starts and which way it goes! Always start from the dot!	Work through the PowerPoint on Math Thursday, counting down from the numbers shown on the screen. Can you count down with your eyes shut? Can you write all the numbers counting down from each starting number? 	A counting down game You will need Maths Friday pages , a dice and counters Play this game with a grown up. You each need a vertical space number line and a counter. Place the counter at 10 and roll a dice. Count back the number you have thrown. Who can reach 0 first and blast off into space? Play the game a few times.
