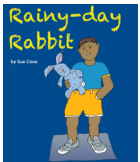
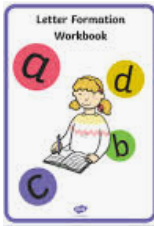
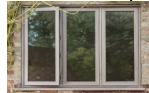


Daily Literacy and Maths Activities - wb - 20th July

<u>Literacy</u> This week is the final week of our Literacy project all about Rainy-day Rabbit! 	Fun Phonics Game Look at the Literacy Monday pages and the print out or make your own carrot phonics cards. Review over the sounds on each card, with the children, there are words with each one to help with this. Scatter the sound cards on the floor or table and have the children listen and point to as you call out words. Can they recognise the sounds they hear? They may hear 2 sounds in the same word. Fly swatters make this extra fun! 	Writing time! Think carefully about your favourite toy. Why is it special? When did you first have it? Who bought it for you? Draw a picture of your toy and tell us why it is so special to you. You can use the Literacy Tuesday  page to help you.	Handwriting practice! Complete pages in your letter formation booklet. Think carefully where the letter starts and which way it goes! Always start from the dot! 	Through your window! Whilst you've been at home you may not have seen as many people family or friends as you usually do but this has begun to change. Some people are now allowed to visit and some still visit our houses as part of their jobs. Use the Literacy Thursday page to help you think about who has visited your house or who you've seen through your window! 	Today is the last day of our home learning plans but it is still very important that you keep reading over the summer so you are ready for year 1. So today we have set you a reading challenge. The challenge is to take books with you and read in many places outside. Read while lying on a patch of grass. Hunt for a web and read to a spider. Go outside at night and read under the stars. Read in or under a tree. How many can you do? Will you get a full house? Take photos and complete the record sheet to show us! 
<u>Maths</u> This week we are going to look at making patterns.	Look through the pattern PowerPoint on Maths Monday page. Talk about the patterns you see and where else we might find patterns. Go for a pattern hunt around your house and garden. What can you find? Either take photos or draw pictures of the things with patterns that you find and use these to make a pattern board! How many different ones can you find? 	Can you continue a pattern that has already started? Look at the pattern pages on the maths Tuesday and see if you can continue the patterns. There are some blank ones to make up your own! The caterpillar and butterfly sheets are perfect for painting with cotton buds! 	Complete pages in your number formation booklet.  Think carefully where the number starts and which way it goes! Always start from the dot!	Ask an adult to help you gather a mixture of buttons, pennies and similar small objects. Create patterns with these objects. Can you make patterns in a spiral or along a zigzag line like shown here?  How many different patterns can you make? Take photos of each one!	Make a fruit kebab using a pattern. Choose 2 or 3 of your favourite fruits and ask an adult to help you cut them into slices. Put the fruit onto the kebab stick making a pattern, Take a photo of your tasty pattern treat before you eat it!
