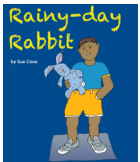
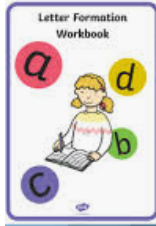
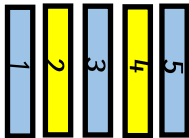


Daily Literacy and Maths Activities - wb - 13th July

<u>Literacy</u> This week is the second week of our Literacy project all about Rainy day Rabbit! 	Follow the instructions on the literacy Monday Page to create a note on a flower shaped boat.  What message would you send? Is this a good way to send a message to a friend? Discuss what might go wrong with an adult.	Have you ever looked up at the sky and seen pictures or creatures in the clouds? Have a look outside and see what you can spot. If you spot anything special take a photo to share!  Look at the Literacy Tuesday sheet and see what you can see in the clouds there. Write a sentence for each to explain what you see.	<u>Handwriting practice!</u> Complete pages in your letter formation booklet. Think carefully where the letter starts and which way it goes! Always start from the dot! 	Let's learn a rhyme together and add some actions. Look at the Literacy Thursday page and read through the 'Little Peter Rabbit' rhyme. What actions can you think of to do with the rhyme as you say it. Can you learn the Makaton actions too? Make up other parts of the body the fly might land on. What other rabbit rhymes do you know?	Look at the Literacy Friday page. Read the words at the bottom of the page with an adult. There are some tricky words there that you will need help with. Practice writing labels using the words you have been given 
<u>Maths</u> This week we are going to look at odd and even numbers	Make strips of paper in two colours. Take it in turns to write numbers first on one colour then the next from 0 to 20. Link the numbers in order into a chain with the numbers showing. Count the numbers on the first colour from 0 these are even numbers. The other colour shows odd numbers. Count the even numbers and then the odd numbers.  	Watch the number blocks episode https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08r2l4d/numberblocks-series-2-odds-and-evens Cut out the numicon shapes and numbers out. Place them in order with the numbers underneath.  Blue square numbers are odd and those with red squares are even. Look at the numicon shapes what can you see? Now practice counting in odd and even numbers. 	Complete pages in your number formation booklet.  Think carefully where the number starts and which way it goes! Always start from the dot!	Take a handful from a pot of buttons, counters pennies or similar objects. Can you tell if you have an odd or even number without counting them? Line the objects up in pairs.  Do you have a counter left over? All even numbers can be put into pairs and counted in 2s. Practice this with other handfuls!	Look at the Maths Friday page. Cut out and sort the tens frames and stick them into the correct box to say if they show an odd or even number. Can you explain how you know just by looking at the tens frame if it is odd or even?
