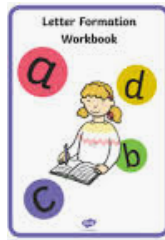


Daily Literacy and Maths Activities - wb - 29th June

Literacy <i>This week is the third week of our new Literacy project all about Max the dog!</i>	<u>Sounds right!</u> Look at the words on the Literacy Monday page, Read the words carefully and listen for words that sound the same. Remember they might not start with the same sound but the middle and end sounds will sound the same. Use some coloured pencils or pens to colour words that rhyme, the same colour! sack brick rock check	<u>Reading Time</u> Read the list of words on the Literacy Tuesday page. These words can be used to help you make sentences up about a dog's walking adventure. Make up some sentences of your own. Practice saying your sentences using different tones of voice to make the sentences sound different!	<u>Handwriting practice!</u> Complete pages in your letter formation booklet. Think carefully where the letter starts and which way it goes! Always start from the dot! 	<u>Writing time</u> Think of the sentences you made on Tuesday, today you are going to write these sentences using our sounds and our neatest letter formation. Look at the Literacy Thursday page. Think about each sound in the words and where each letter starts as you write. Make this your best writing yet! 	<u>Weaving Fun!</u> Today you will need Straws or small sticks, a collection of ribbons, wool, string, pieces of fabric, coloured paper, tape, a board or strong card. Now read together and follow the instructions on the Literacy Friday page to try your hand at weaving  
Maths <i>This week we are going to look at doubles first to 10 and then to 20.</i>	<u>Find a double game</u> This game involves using 2 dice or playing cards [aces to 5s]. Role the dice or pick 2 cards from the shuffled small pack. Look for a double. Are they the same?  If they are, count how many you have in total and say 'Double 2 is and score a point. If not play again.	<u>Butterfly doubles to 10</u> Look through the butterfly PowerPoint on Maths Tuesday pages and work out all the doubles to 10 on the butterflies.  Next, use the butterfly sheet colouring in the spots on the other wing and completing the number sentence. If can't print the butterflies you can draw your own!	Complete pages in your number formation booklet.  Think carefully where the number starts and which way it goes! Always start from the dot!	<u>Numicon doubles</u> Cut out the numicon shapes on Maths Thursday page 1 and match the pairs. Make up the number sentences for the doubles from Double 1. Next look at the Thursday page 2 and cut and stick the small numicon writing the number sentences. 	<u>Ladybird doubles to 20</u> Look through the Ladybird PowerPoint on Maths Friday page 1 recalling doubles to 10 and moving on to doubles to 20. Take time to go through the pages, counting the spots carefully, using accurate pointing as you count. Now complete the Ladybird sheet on Maths Friday page 2, drawing the spots and writing the number sentence.
