KEY INDICATORS

All our programmes and projects helps schools work towards the 5 Key Indicators of the Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding Action Plan. We have highlighted which Key Indicators each project has worked towards.

KEY INDICATOR 1

The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity for at least 60 active minutes a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.

KEY INDICATOR 2

The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.

KEY INDICATOR 3

Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.

KEY INDICATOR 4

Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.

KEY INDICATOR 5

Increased participation in competitive sport.



WHAT A YEAR!

Throughout the year we ran over 56 school sports events, from Sports Hall Athletics to Primary Rounders. We had an amazing 713 school teams, made up of 9601 students join us at our festivals and competitions. We had 1114 SEND students attend our PLUS festivals which are targeted to support those with additional needs.

This summer, we have used the power of the Commonwealth Games to inspire young people to participate in sports. This included our hugely popular Commonwealth Games Mega Fests, which took place at Moorways.

Throughout the year we have supported almost 200 teachers with their continuous professional development. This has taken various forms with workshops delivered as part of INSET days, PLPS Teacher Support programme, ECT Introduction to PE Course and on May 27th we hosted the Derbyshire PE Conference at Pride Park Stadium with 65 teachers from over 50 schools attending.

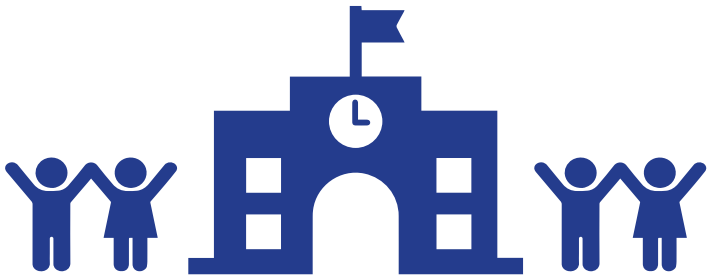

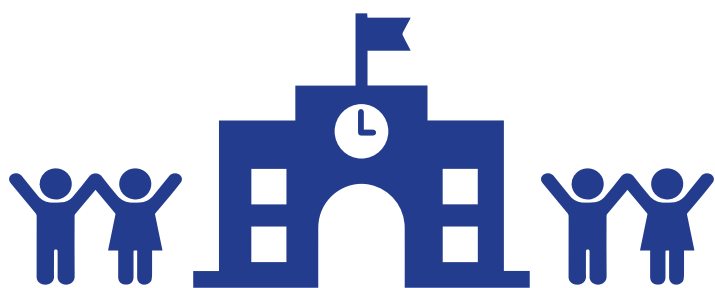

TRACK AND FIELD

The Primary School Track and Field event is an annual competition for primary school pupils, in which they participate in standing triple jump, shot put throw, long jump, howler throw and running events. We had an amazing 144 pupils compete from nine different primary schools.

The top three schools were Silverhill Primary in first place, Cavendish Close Junior in second and Walter Evans in third place.

MINI LEADERS

The Mini Leaders Sports Award is a KS2 programme which aims to develop leadership skills. The aim is for the leaders to set up their own activities for other pupils to participate in.

Over the course of the year, we engaged with eight different schools to train 198 Mini Leaders.

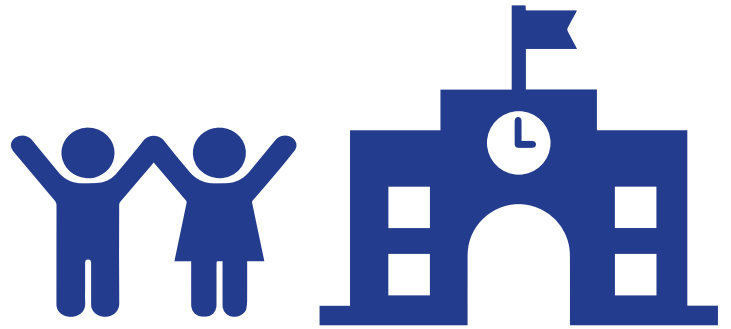

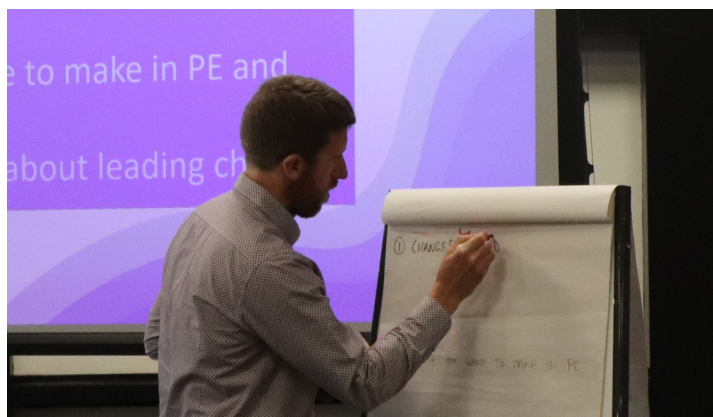

DERBYSHIRE PE CONFERENCE

On Friday 27th May we hosted the Derbyshire PE Conference for our Super Schools network at Pride Park Stadium. Schools listened to key notes from Sue Wilkinson (CEO of Association of PE) and Will Swaithe from PE Scholar, along with participating in a range of workshops covering Deep Dives in to PE, Holistic Curriculum Design and How to Promote 60 Active Minutes in School.

Delegates said: "The conference had excellent speakers and useful ideas to take back to school" and was "informative, relevant and engaging, offering ideas that will work at a real world level."

ECT INTRODUCTION TO PE

This year we supported 24 Early Career Teachers (ECTs) with half termly workshops to develop their knowledge of the PE Curriculum and teaching strategies to help them deliver PE to their classes.

Teachers learnt how to deliver: Invasion Games, Gymnastics, Dance, Striking and Fielding and Outdoor Adventurous Activities.

The aim of the course is to provide a sound understanding of what the PE curriculum looks like over a typical academic year, by training delegates to deliver lesson plans and activities.

DCCT is part of the Girls' Football in School Partnership network which works towards providing girls with equal opportunities to play football. Our end of year survey found that 83% of Derby primary schools offer equal opportunities for girls to play football in PE and 80% offer at least a half term of girls' football extra-curricular clubs.

This year we have launched our This Girl Can pilot project, which is a Female Football leadership project delivered in schools as part of PE lessons. We worked with Bishop Lonsdale C of E Primary School and Pear Tree Junior School with 16 young leaders. The students then ran football lessons for other students in their class and will continue to act as ambassadors for girls' football next year.

The Shooting Stars programme continued to be popular with schools, the Disney inspired football lessons encourage young people to play football by using pupils' favourite stories such as Lion King, Toy Story and Frozen. We trained 26 new teachers to deliver the Shooting Stars lessons this year, and delivered six Shooting Stars Festivals with 812 students participating throughout the year.

We have ran more girls' football events than ever, with 16 girls' only festivals and competitions this academic year. This includes the Women's Euros Festivals which celebrated the competition being hosted in England this summer. 124 students attended the festival on 1st July at Moorways, taking part in a range of fun games to develop their football skills. Students were directed to local Wildcats centres so that they could continue their football journey.

PREMIER LEAGUE PRIMARY STARS



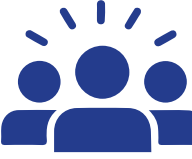
Premier League Primary Stars has delivered across 50 schools in the Derby and Derbyshire area during the last academic year. Supported by the Premier League Charitable Fund, the programme uses the appeal of the Premier League to engage with participants in a range of subjects through interventions such as Reading Stars, Matchday Maths and Resilient Rammie. In addition, we have also supported nationwide campaigns such as Rainbow Laces Day, Anti-Bullying Week and World Maths Day, whilst also partnering with The Woodland Trust to teach participants about the importance of social action and climate change through Black, White and Green.

We also invited enhanced schools to take part in Pride Park Poetry during the summer term. Schools were invited to a poetry workshop at the stadium, engaging with different types of poetry and learning about the DCFC poem We Are Derby. Participants were then given an opportunity to write their own poem or even football chant before performing them in different areas of the stadium, including the home dressing rooms, the dugouts and the stands, as part of their tour.

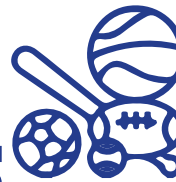
